



CEPA Core Objectives

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Family Centered Care/Nutrition

Expand access to PPTCT+ and pediatric treatment, care, and support, including nutrition services, and integrate child and family health services with other health services in order to improve survival rates and health outcomes for children, HIV-positive mothers, and their families.

→Integration of services under one roof.

→HAART for all women from pregnancy through breast feeding

Early Infant Diagnosis/ Treatment

Expand access to early infant diagnosis and earlier and improved pediatric treatment in order to improve survival rates and health outcomes for children.

- ❑ Adoption of WHO guidelines on early infant testing and treatment
- ❑ Build and expand infrastructure for EID/T

Access to Medicines

Reduce distribution barriers and increase the global supply of high-quality, low-cost lifesaving medicines for children and their families, including ARVs, drugs to treat opportunistic infections, and first and second-line regimens to ease dosing and administration.

- UNITAID patent pool
- In-country registration
- Procurement, distribution and supply chain management
- New FDCs, 2nd and 3rd line meds

Full Funding

Secure the financial resources needed to facilitate country-level scale-up of PPTCT+ and pediatric and maternal treatment programs, and ensure access to family planning services as an essential component of comprehensive PPTCT+ programming.

- ❑ Funding prioritization of PPTCT and pediatric HIV treatment and care by donors and national governments
- ❑ Global forecasting of PPTCT and Pediatric drugs and commodities
- ❑ Tracking of HIV funding
